WELCOME TO THE 35TH ANNIVERSARY SEASON WITH THE NORTHERN ARTS AND CULTURAL CENTRE

It is hard to believe that the Northern Arts and Cultural Centre (NACC) is celebrating its 35th Anniversary. Not that long ago, we were in full swing planning the 30th Anniversary of NACC. Time flies when a facility is used to host creativity, education and performances. Thank you for taking the time to see what is in store for our 2019-2020 season.

As we turn the corner into a new decade, performing artists from all disciplines in their style and background will come into the Northern scene bringing to you new sounds, concepts, visuals and stories. NACC keeps working to redefine the ways performing arts is thought of, created and shared. It's all part of our desire to foster a dynamic relationship with the industry as it evolves, and to position ourselves as not only responsive to the tides, but as forerunners, catalyst, and thought leaders in the field across the Northwest Territories (NWT).

We kick off this season with a legend in Canada, half of Kashtin, the outstanding singer-songwriter Florent Vollant. Those 35 and up will remember growing up with the sound of this amazing Indigenous leader in Canada. This is a year marked by firsts and premieres. For the first time ever we are touring an internationally acclaimed dance company to four communities. NACC will host the Canadian premiere of Frankenstein, the latest show by Chicago's Manual Cinema. We will tour Pawâkan Macbeth, a new play from Akpik Theatre, presented for the first time outside of the Treaty 6 Territory.

This season is the first time NACC presents a large-scale circus show, Unikkaaqtuat, a brand-new work created by Artcirq, The 7 Fingers and Taqqut Productions. Thanks to an unexpected invitation in 2018 while in New York, I had the privilege of meeting world-class opera singer Kofi Hayford. Together, we designed a new Christmas opera and gospel concert with some of the rising opera stars from New York and accompanied by William Hicks, the former pianist of Luciano Pavarotti.

From the North, we gathered together Gail Cyr and her son Jesse Wheeler with Ollie Williams to create a brand-new show for the Ko K'e Spoken Word & Music Festival. Add a treat in TłĮchǫ and Dene Zhatié with Digawolf and Johnny Landry. The list of gems this season goes on.

Finally, we will offer to community members a new sing-along movie series and a rising star series highlighting the young prodigies in classical music. This season will also be an opportunity to introduce community members to new partnerships and co-productions between NACC and NWT artists and arts companies. Stay tuned for a refresh of our website mid-autumn.

On behalf of the NACC Board of Directors, staff and myself, it is our honor to present the 35th Season on the traditional territory of the First Nations, Inuit and Métis across the 5 regions of NWT. Patrons, colleagues, Board Members, volunteers, partners and funders are all a huge part of our success. They lend a wealth of knowledge and experience to the organization, and are in my opinion, the key to NACC's success.

We hope you will find the season insightful, moving and artistically engaging.

PRESHOW

The Northern Arts and Cultural Centre showcases local performers in the lobby for an hour before each NACC presentation. Information about these preshows can be found on our website on the event page under preshow information. Doors open one hour before the show. This provides a great opportunity to meet up and take in the ambiance of our lovely atrium. During this time the concession is open, the local art exhibit is on display, and the lobby is set up with tables and chairs to allow patrons to watch in comfort.

MONTHLY ART EXHIBIT

Every month, NACC showcases the work of a different local artist with an exhibit on display in the lobby during our presentations. The artist profile and examples of their work are visible on the home page of NACC's website. Artwork is available for purchase from the box office, with the majority of the proceeds going to the exhibiting artist. Artwork is available for all patrons to pick up at the end of the month when the exhibit is over. As well, we will have one exhibit a year for emerging talent.

Our concession offers a wide selection of snacks and beverages including beer and wine. You can purchase a reusable NACC cup sponsored by NWT Brewing Company and bring wine or beer with you into the theatre to enjoy during the performance.

ACCOMPANIED WITH BAND

HALF OF KASHTIN, ARDENT DEFENDER OF QUEBEC'S LAKES AND RIVERS

Innu author, composer and singer Florent Vollant has been a driving force among First Nations musicians since he began his musical career in the mid-80s—and the singer shows no sign of slowing down.

When Vollant joined forces with Claude McKenzie, Kashtin was born. From 1989-95, the duo recorded three albums of harmony-rich acoustic folkrock sung mainly in Innu, earning them four Félix awards, a Juno award, a major-label record deal and the chance to perform across Canada, Europe, South Korea, the United States, Bolivia and beyond.

Kashtin was the first Indigenous group from Quebec to be recognized internationally and one of the most commercially successful and famous musical groups in First Nations history. Kashtin means "tornado" in Innu and is also a clever pun in response to friends alleging that the band was selling out.

In 2018 he released an 11-track album composed in country-folk and tex-mex flavours, *Mitsha Meshkenu*, "The Great Road." Mitsha Meshkenu is the 138, the oldest road in the territory that Florent has traveled a lot. The release of his 6th solo album, warmly welcomed by critics, and followed by a tour of shows in France, Switzerland and Belgium in the spring of 2019.

With many adventures under her belt, she tells stories of humble roots—from a lost foster child, to head of a legal services program, and reuniting with her siblings in Nelson House and the Nisishawayasihk Cree Nation. Jesse Wheeler, her son, will join to tell stories of growing up in Yellowknife. Ollie Williams, from Cabin Radio joins them for this laughter-filled and poignant evening.

A RISING STAR BROUGHT TO YOU IN PARTNERSHIP WITH BLACK ICE SOUND

At age seven, Canadian pianist Anastasia Rizikov made her orchestral debut with the National Philharmonic Symphony Orchestra of Ukraine after winning the Vladimir Horowitz International Piano Competition. Now 20, Anastasia has placed first in a handful of international piano competitions, among them a win at age sixteen in the Jaén International Piano Competition in Spain.

With over 30 orchestral performances and 20 concerti in her repertoire, Anastasia has already played with major orchestras of Canada, the United States, and Europe, taking her to such prestigious halls as Carnegie Hall, Roy Thomson Hall, Hong Kong City Hall, the Kremlin, and in festivals such as Verbier and Orford.

Her first CD, recorded at age sixteen under the NAXOS label, received worldwide critical acclaim, acknowledging her as "one to watch." This season Anastasia's concert schedule brings her to several appearances with orchestra as a soloist, performing Rachmaninoff's Paganini Variations, as well as Shostakovich's Piano Concerto No. 1, as well as to solo recitals in Poland, Spain, and France.

In 2017, she began studies at École Normale de Musique de Paris with Professor Marian Rybicki, and from 2003-2017 she studied with Professor Maia Spis at the Nadia Music Academy, Toronto. Adept in English, Russian, Ukrainian (and working towards mastering her French), Anastasia takes an avid interest in reading, as well as public speaking.

The VIMFF itself is an annual international 9-day community festival, featuring mountain film screenings, live multimedia presentations, photography exhibitions, workshops, seminars & other special events.

WINNER OF 2017 ORCHESTRE SYMPHONIQUE DE MONTRÉAL MANULIFE COMPETITION

Benjamin was accepted at the Conservatoire de Musique de Montréal in 2010 where he spent 6 years under the guidance of Marie-Andrée Benny. After completing his Baccalaureate degree, he pursued his studies at the Yale School of Music with internationally renowned flutist and pedagogue, Ransom Wilson, recently obtaining a Master of Music degree. Additionally, Benjamin has taken master classes with flutists such as Mathieu Dufour, Emmanuel Pahud, Philippe Bernold, Jeanne Baxtresser, and Robert Langevin.

In addition to distinguishing himself in regional competitions, notably winning the Grand Prize at the Concours de Musique Classique de Lanaudière (2013), and placing first in his category at the Sorel Tracy Festival in 2011 and 2013, Benjamin was awarded the first prize at the Canadian Music Competition in 2010. Most recently, Benjamin received the Grand Prize at the prestigious OSM Manulife Competition, making his début with the Orchestre Symphonique de Montréal. Benjamin has also been invited as a guest soloist with the Orchestre Métropolitain du Grand Montréal, the Redlands Symphony Orchestra, and the Newfoundland Symphony Orchestra.

In January 2018, he recorded Sergei Prokofiev's Sonata for Flute and Piano op.94, Francis Poulenc's Flute and Piano Sonata, and Denis Gougeon's L'Oiseau Blessé with pianist Mariane Patenaude in Radio-Canada studios, subsequently broadcasted on ICI-Musique. Her dish holds beautiful foods from around the world—but be careful, stealing from her is dangerous business because Th'owxiya has developed a taste for children. When Th'owxiya catches a hungry mouse, Kw'atel, stealing a piece of cheese from her mouth she demands two child spirits be brought for her to eat or else, she will eat Kw'atel's whole family.

Ignorant to her power, yet desperate to save her family, Kw'atel sets forth on an intense journey to fulfill Th'owxiya's demand. With the help of the Sqeweqs (Raven), two Spa:th (bears), and Sasq'ets (Sasquatch), Kw'at'el finds alternate gifts to appease the goddess and the journey becomes one of knowledge, understanding and forgiveness. Sometimes tricking an ancient spirit is the best step forward!

"THE OLD STORIES"—AN ACROBATIC CELEBRATION OF ANCIENT INUIT CULTURE, TRADITIONS & VISION FOR THE FUTURE

Unikkaaqtuat—The Old Stories—is a multidisciplinary production inspired by Inuit founding myths and illustrated by the world-renowned artist Germaine Arnaktauyok. This unprecedented creation highlights the Inuit people, their traditions, and vision for the future, through a collaborative and mutually respectful process bringing Inuit and non-Inuit artists together.

In an atmosphere shaped by video projections and a world of shadows, a diverse cast of actors, three Inuit musicians and four Inuit circus artists and four Montréal-based circus artists come together on stage to transport you to an ancient world before life had not known death, days had not seen light, and where Inuit had not met white people. Until...

Unikkaaqtuat is set to highlight the talents of Inuit artists at a national and international scale, and foster a unique environment for cross-cultural collaboration to flourish within and beyond the project.

Expect the spectacular—aerial maneuvers such as flying trapezes, aerial silks and trampoline launches, along with traditional drumming and dancing, singing and shadow theatre. The show was designed to premiere on gigantic stages around the world, as well as smaller ones to reach northern communities.



AN INITIATION INTO THE ANCIENT ART OF FLAMENCO

One enters into Flamenco as one enters into religion.

RITE exposes the relationship between body, rhythm, voice and guitar. At the heart of this artistic proposition lies an intimate conversation where each element reveals itself while defining the other. La Otra Orilla's new traditional *tablao* format is an initiatory journey that will engage both the aficionado and the newcomer to the art of flamenco. Rite is an energetic, poetic and powerful show.

Works by acclaimed production company La Otra Orilla (The Other Shore) are recognizable for their unique and radical approach to flamenco, reflecting an absolutely transdisciplinary vision. The company was founded in Montreal in 2006, born of the artistic complicity of its directors, Myriam Allard and Hedi Graja.

Although the artists share a profound knowledge of both the technique and spirit of flamenco acquired during their many years in Andalusia, their signature style is resolutely contemporary, actively incorporating elements from other disciplines. Poetic and often tinged with a wry humour, their works are a surprising combination of dance, vocal and instrumental music, and theatre. La Otra Orilla is a unique, bold voice rooted in the ancient art of flamenco yet projecting it with a current and audacious approach.

USING SHADOW PUPPETRY, CINEMATIC TECHNIQUES, AND LIVE INSTRUMENTATION, MANUAL CINEMA RECOUNTS A THRILLING CLASSIC GOTHIC TALE

Love, loss, and creation merge in unexpected ways in this thrilling classic gothic tale conceived by Manual Cinema. In a special Canadian premiere presentation, internationally-renowned multimedia company Manual Cinema stitches together the classic story of Frankenstein with Mary Shelley's own biography to create an unexpected story about the beauty and horror of creation.

Stories of Mary Shelley, Victor Frankenstein, and his Monster expose how the forces of family, community, and education shape personhood—or destroy it by their absence.

Manual Cinema combines handmade shadow puppetry, cinematic techniques, and innovative sound and music to create immersive visual stories for stage and screen. A live band creates the soundtrack in realtime onstage, hundreds of sound cues creating movie theatre-style immersive sound design that envelopes the audience in the sonic world of the show. Puppeteers play dozens of characters and manipulate over 500 paper puppets to create what looks like a silent animated film right in front of their eyes.

Court Theatre presented the World Premiere of Frankenstein in Chicago, November, 2018. Frankenstein had its New York premiere at The Public Theatre's Under the Radar Festival in January 2019.

Set in Plains Cree territory in the 1870s, before the establishment of First Nations reserves, Pawâkan Macbeth takes place in a time when First Nations warred with each other and the Canadian Government over territory, food supply and trade. Harsh environments brought immense fear, starvation, and uncertainty together to awaken the darkest of Cree spirits, the Wihtiko – an evil being with an insatiable appetite for human flesh.

Inspired from stories shared by Indigenous Elders in Frog Lake First Nation following protocol, Arluk has created a new, visceral experience of Macbeth; a convergence of Shakespeare's language, modern English, and Cree. As historical wars are waged with the Cree and Nakoda against the Blackfoot, Macikosisân (Macbeth), a great Okihcitâw (warrior), becomes consumed by the cannibal spirit Wihtiko. He plots with Kâwanihot Iskwew (Lady Macbeth) to kill their Chief, Okimâw Wîpâstim (Duncan). Pawâkan Macbeth is a terrifying journey through love, greed, honor and betrayal, with trickster beings that lie like truth.

Headquartered in Yellowknife Bay, the practice works to find a nexus between art-making, autobiographical mythology, and pragmatic living.



KIERA-DAWN KOLSON is an award winning multidisciplinary artist, performer and young leader. For over 20 years, she has been involved internationally in advocacy work on Indigenous peoples rights, the environment, cultural preservation, decolonization, and empowerment through art and culture. She is passionate about revitalization of Indigenous heritage and will continue to inspire the next generations to live their gifts.



MARTIN REHAK is a multi disciplinary artist and standup comedian who primarily produces comedic video shorts that incorporate practical effects such as stopmotion and puppetry; often times designing and creating props and sets all by hand. Currently he is writing and developing a multimedia stage performance consisting of live humouristic story telling assisted by video projections that will take you on a journey into the absurd.



MIRANDA CURRIE Children's entertainer Miranda Currie writes fun, catchy, and original kid friendly songs with a northern Indigenous flair! Miranda uses fiddle and guitar to convey through song the beauty and adventure she finds near her Yellowknife home, where she lives with her two sled dogs. Her show includes references to the Tlicho language, and songs about her favourite animal the busy beaver! Miranda is an outdoor educator and author of 3 children's books.

NACC's mentorship program is designed to prepare local emerging artists to launch their careers over a span of two years. Each mentee is given business and artistic support to help them hone their show, plan out their promotional strategy, meet important contacts in their discipline and make the leap into professional performance. Applications open up every two years on our website.



WESLEY HARDISTY is a fiddler and composer who blends rock, country, folk, Celtic and Métis sounds into his music. Wesley is from the Dene First Nation and took up fiddle at age 13 in Fort Simpson through the Kole Crook Fiddle Association. He attended the prestigious Gulf Islands School of Performing Arts on Saltspring Island, BC. His debut CD 12:12 won the 2012 Aboriginal Peoples Choice Music Award for Best Fiddle CD.



MIRAJ is an audiovisual electroacoustic duo between Harrison Roberts (DJ Flora) and Sami Blanco (Temple Volant). They collect sounds and visuals from northern field recordings and instruments to blend shape-shifting colors synchronized to electronic soundscapes of dub techno and ambient house. Music and visuals are recorded live using analog sequencers, synthesizers and drum machines mixed in a DJ hybrid format, inspired by the surroundings and the moment.



KAREN NOVAK is a singer, songwriter, multi-instrumentalist and music advocate and full-time performer for over 30 years. An actress with theatre and TV credits, she is currently preparing to relaunch her original music with a theatrical rock trilogy. *Wide Open* is a fantasy story about a mist-being warrior, Satori, who travels to earth to try and save her world from being destroyed. This show incorporates visuals, technology and special tunings to make this live movie an experience.



CROOK THE KID Dylan Jones is a hiphop artist who grew up in the Sahtu community of Fort Good Hope. Under the stage name Crook The Kid, he uses his own life experience and gritty sound to tell a tale of hardship and overcoming one's obstacles in the face of adversity. Dylan recently performed at Ottawa Blues Fest with Wu Tang Clan on the bill and has a European tour booked.

Deano Dei

With so much talent spread across communities all over our territory, there needs to be technicians who are just as talented to help them deliver the best performance possible. This year, NACC partnered with Ryan Dempster, professional sound tech with over 9 years of experience and The Canadian Institute for Theatre Technology to present Amplify Your Career: Youth Live Sound Workshop. The first phase of the program takes place over 4 weeks from June to February. The goal is to build a community of sound technicians in every region of Northwest Territories.

Deano Dei was chosen to be the youth technician, working closely with Ryan in Yellowknife in a week-long intensive workshop leading up to and during Folk On The Rocks, learning the ins and outs of setting up and running sound at a live performance.

Together with Ryan, they will have attended the CITT conference in Whitehorse in August, and presented a panel discussion about the project. In the fall and winter, Deano and Ryan will host 2-day workshops to pass on their knowledge to high school students in Norman Wells and Inuvik, so they can present shows of their own.

Deano Dei is a lifelong artist who found her calling in technical theatre as a teenager. After attending the University of Alberta to study stage management, she returned home to Yellowknife in 2018 to be closer to her Tlicho roots. She is delighted to further explore the discipline of live sound and give back to the next generation of young technicians in the North through NACC's Amplify Your Career project. When not involved in the backstage world, Deano creates digital artwork and printed zines.
